PROVIDE A MEAL to HEALTHCARE WORKERS

Opportunity: Our health care providers are on the front line right now. Offering them a nourishing lunch and utilizing one of Woodland's professional caterers to prepare it will help feed a nurse and assist one of our own. St. Francis Hospital (by floor) and Christ Community Health Center (various locations) are open to receive lunches.

What you can supply: We estimate that lunches will cost about \$10 per head, and the groups will vary in size from 15-30 people. The coordinator will contact the recipient organization to confirm a date and headcount and coordinate arrangements (including delivery) with one of our caterers. The cost of the meal will be met by the group or individual who signs up to serve.

CLASSROOM MONITOR for STREETS Ministries

STREETS Virtual-learning Hub (VLH) will be located at both our Downtown and Graham Heights site, and will provide a safe space to complete their virtual-schooling for up to 80 students (40 at each of our locations). Students with the highest need for STREETS' support and resources will be identified administration and teachers at neighboring school, i.e.. Booker T Washington and Kingsbury Middle and High school.

Currently, we are in need of **classroom monitors** to support our students throughout the school day. At each site, we would like to have 4 volunteers serving at all times (there will be 4 classrooms of students at each location). We plan to run this program for 9 weeks, or until Shelby County Schools allows for an in-person learning option again.

During their shift, VLH volunteers might be asked to hand out breakfast/lunch to students or help them connect to their online classroom. Volunteers will also be asked to help remind students to stay socially-distanced and wear their mask. Students will be engaged in online-learning the majority of the day, but might have 8-10 minutes between academic courses to stretch or use the restroom.

Due to COVID-19 we have specific procedures and policies in place to ensure our students and volunteers stay healthy and safe. Anyone who enters the building must wear a mask and have their temperature checked. Any student who shows symptoms at any point during the day, will be moved to a designated quarantine space and sent home for 10-14 days or until they receive a negative test. All volunteers will be asked to complete a volunteer application and a background check.
